All Fridays of Lent (March 7, 14, 21, 28, April 4, 11, 18) are days of abstinence.


FASTING refers to only one full meal with two small meals and no eating otherwise for the day.

ABSTINENCE refers to not eating meat at all during the day.

All those who have reached their 14th year are obligated to ABSTAIN. The church directs the Holy fast to all those in their 18th year until their 60th year. (Canon 1525) The ancient practice of fasting and abstaining can occur throughout the other days of Lent. This is not obligatory and can take a variety of forms distinct from food.
